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INTRO

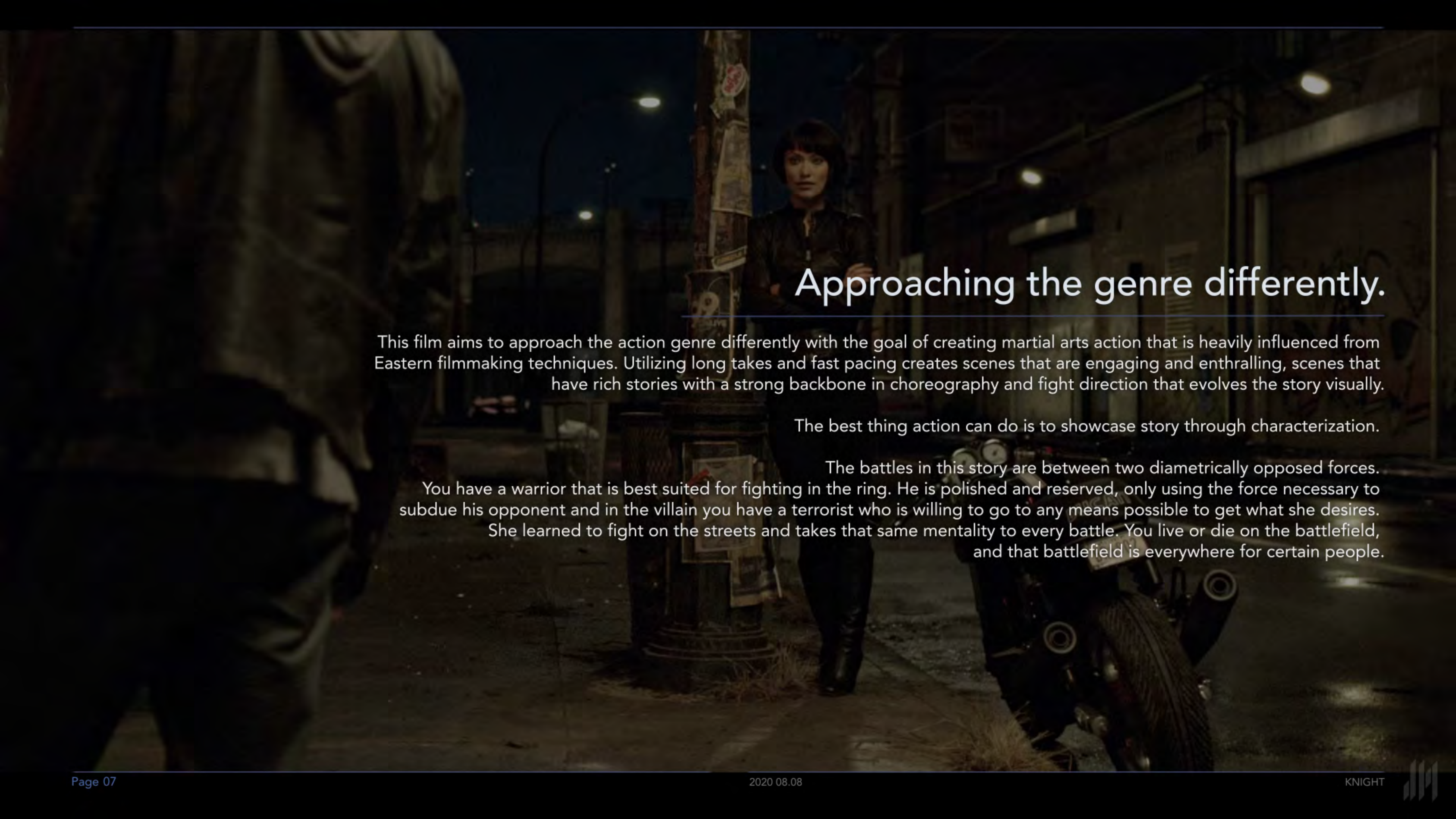

Unforgettable Action

Action in the Superhero drama is some of the most sought after and highly polished action in the world today. In order to separate this from other super hero films we plan on having over the top action combined with gritty down to earth fights that will leave you breathless. We're not trying to compete with Marvel or DC in terms of action, but we are in terms of stakes. You don't take fifty shots to give one in Knight. If you get hit badly, you go down, if you get cut, you bleed and may potentially die. The stakes have never been higher and then you tack on rooftop chases, bank heists, explosions and hand-to-hand combat that you will feel in your bones and you've got a unforgettable action film.





Approaching the genre differently.

This film aims to approach the action genre differently with the goal of creating martial arts action that is heavily influenced from Eastern filmmaking techniques. Utilizing long takes and fast pacing creates scenes that are engaging and enthralling, scenes that have rich stories with a strong backbone in choreography and fight direction that evolves the story visually.

The best thing action can do is to showcase story through characterization.

The battles in this story are between two diametrically opposed forces. You have a warrior that is best suited for fighting in the ring. He is polished and reserved, only using the force necessary to subdue his opponent and in the villain you have a terrorist who is willing to go to any means possible to get what she desires. She learned to fight on the streets and takes that same mentality to every battle. You live or die on the battlefield, and that battlefield is everywhere for certain people.



Heart-felt Storytelling

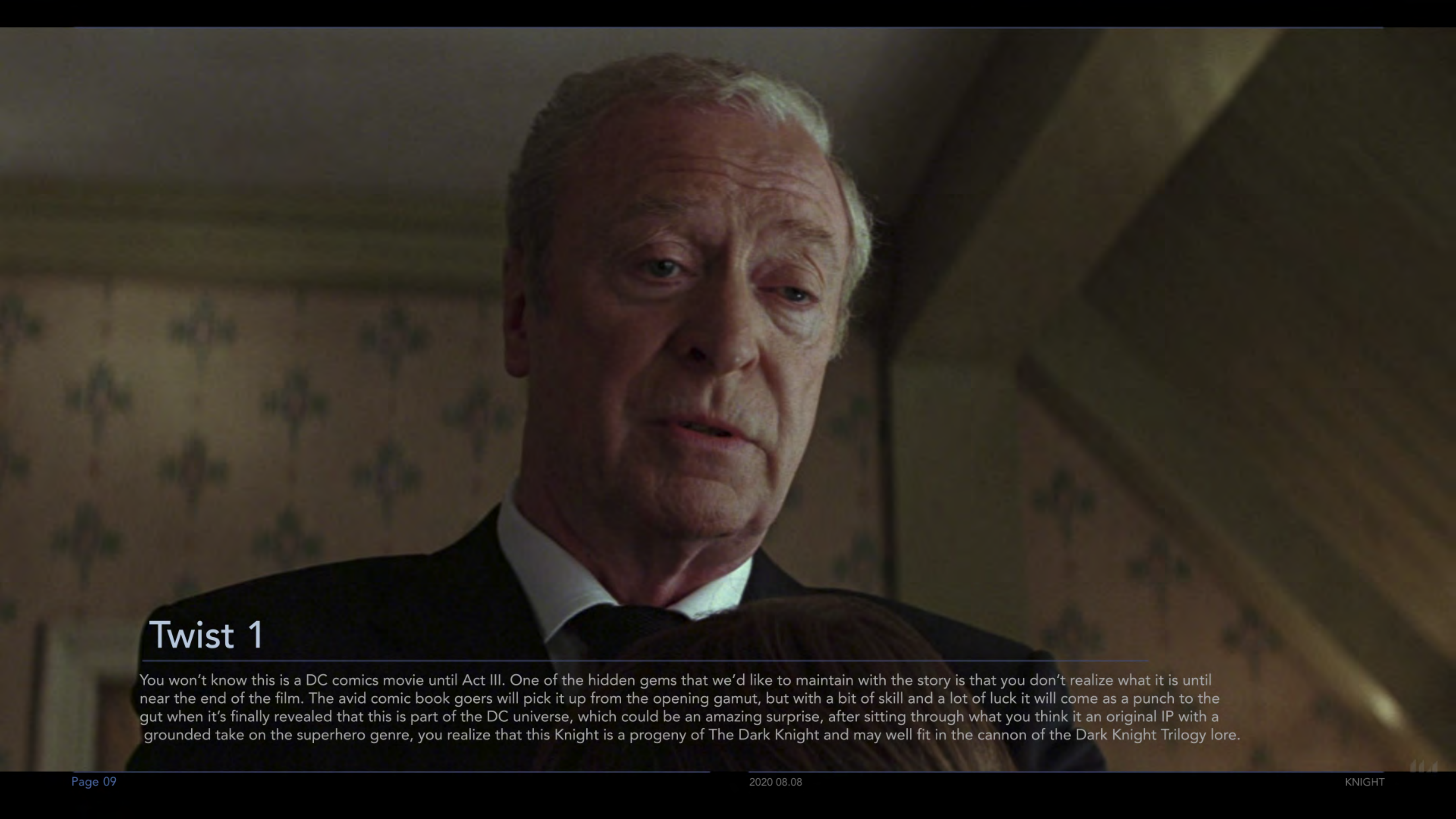
Not only are our hero and villain diametrically opposed in their martial arts styles but also in their convictions.

Luke was born into poverty and through the hard work and dedication of his father, his family found themselves in a dramatically different world and life. A world of private schools and gated walls. A lifestyle he didn't ask for but knows how to navigate. A lifestyle that he feels uncomfortable in and works hard to get what he desires.

Whereas our main antagonist, Lady Vic, was raised in a life of luxury and had poverty thrust upon her during her formative years. Imagine growing up with a silver spoon and having everything at your fingertips and then suddenly having it ripped from beneath you despite it not having anything to do with you. Having everything ripped from your fingertips because of a conglomerate that clearly couldn't care less about the individual.

After being thrust out, she spent years wandering the planet learning the best ways to kill, before making it her goal and drive to exact revenge upon the wealthy elite of Wayne Tech that caused her family to lose their generations old wealth and power.





Twist 1

You won't know this is a DC comics movie until Act III. One of the hidden gems that we'd like to maintain with the story is that you don't realize what it is until near the end of the film. The avid comic book goers will pick it up from the opening gamut, but with a bit of skill and a lot of luck it will come as a punch to the gut when it's finally revealed that this is part of the DC universe, which could be an amazing surprise, after sitting through what you think it an original IP with a grounded take on the superhero genre, you realize that this Knight is a progeny of The Dark Knight and may well fit in the cannon of the Dark Knight Trilogy lore.



Twist 2

The second twist is that our diametrically opposed hero and villain fall in love early in the script. This unwittingly becomes a tale of two people from opposite sides of the economic divide that have pasts that are mirror-opposites and the only way that they can overcome both of their greatest weaknesses is through the help of the other. In the final showdown Lady Vic realizes that Luke is right in his convictions and that he is fighting for what he believes in and what makes him strong is his family. Whereas Luke realizes that Lady Vic is right about certain aspects of her ideology. The wealthy elite have corrupt Gotham and are doing terrible things throughout the world.

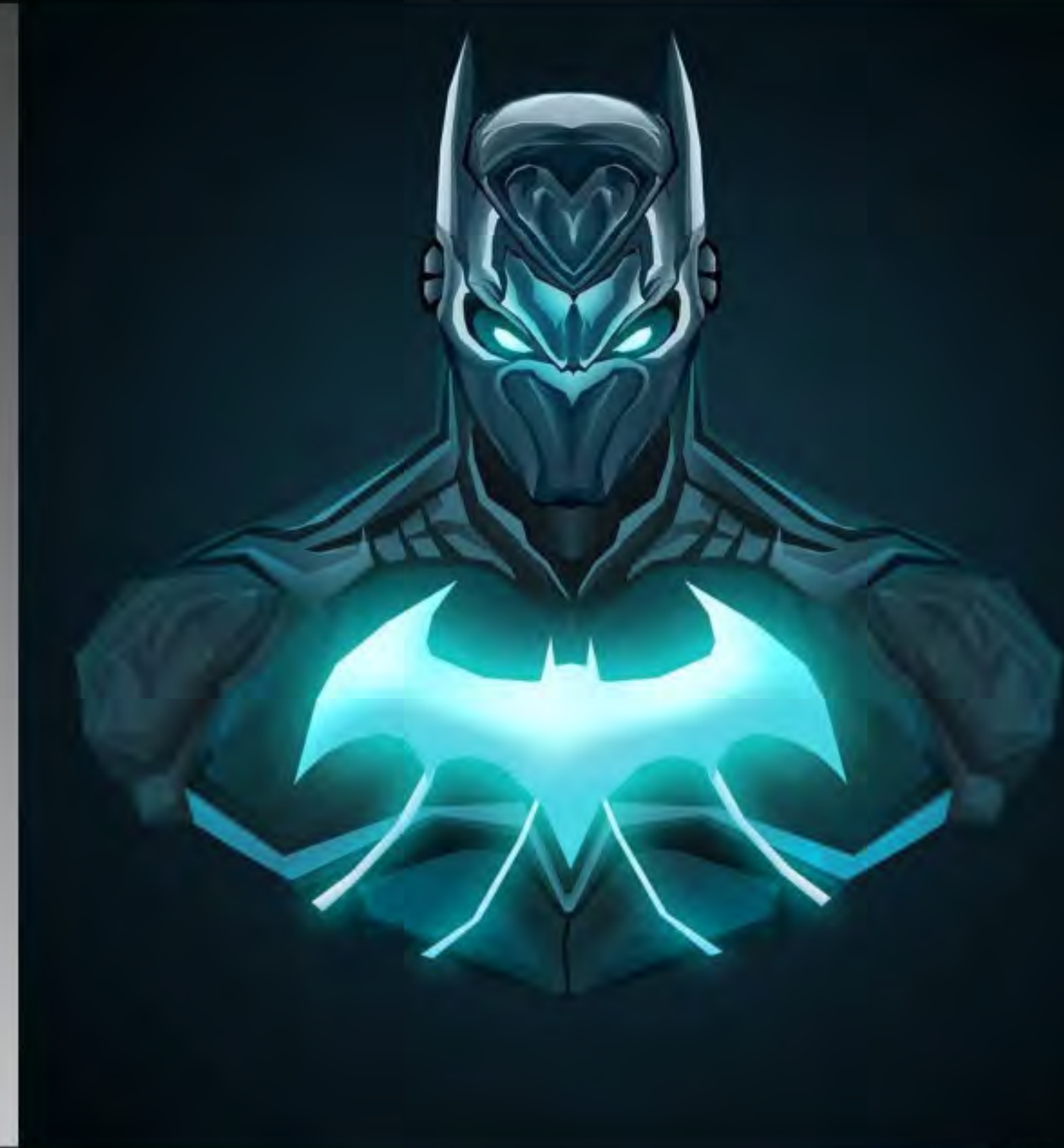
Only when they meet in the middle are they both able to realize their flaws and overcome them together.

The Suit

The suit will play an integral role in this film as it is the hallmark of a superhero and the first version will be ugly. Not quite Iron Man Mark 1 ugly, but it will definitely be a hodgepodge of materials cobbled together to somewhat resemble military grade gear (seeing as how Luke is stealing the gear from Wayne Tech)

After Luke fails in this suit he turns to Duke to help him build a suit that reacts to his movements and enhances them, it may even have a few toys. Lady Vic destroys this suit and the two are left to start over. With a little help they end up building the Mark III Suit.

The Mark III suit will be a close amalgamation of the suit from the comics with a more tactical leaning feel of modern day military infrastructure, a la, something between Batman's suit from The Dark Knight trilogy and Iron Man's polished chrome suit.



CINEMATOGRAPHY

Pushing the boundaries of cinematography will be paramount to this film's success.

The bounds of cinematography are limitless and creating stunning images is of integral importance in modern day filmmaking, in a world where everything is fighting for your attention and every notification on your phone threatens storytelling, every moment needs to be pure spectacle.





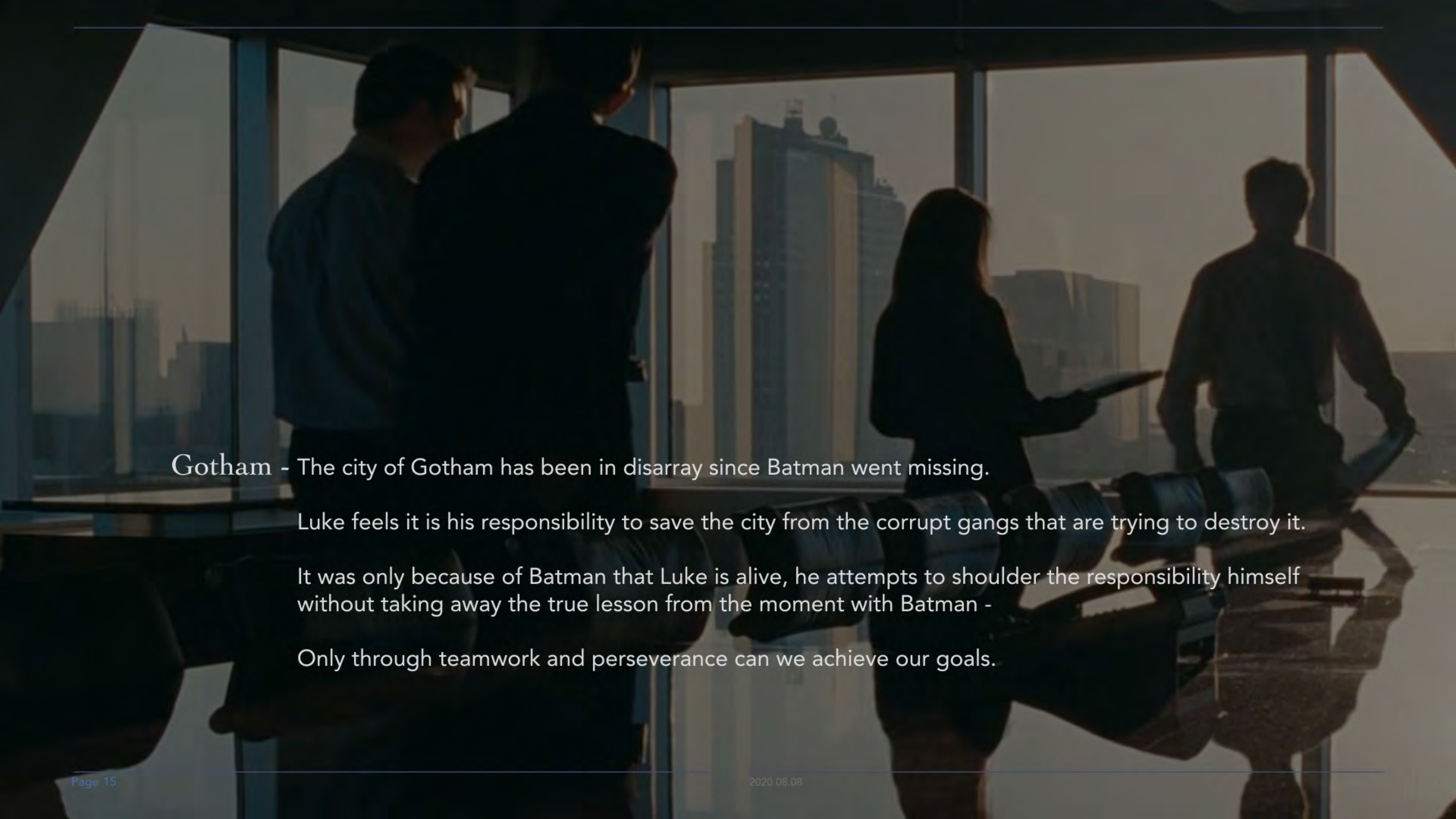

It was only because of Batman that Luke is alive, he attempts to shoulder the responsibility himself without taking away the true lesson from the moment with Batman -

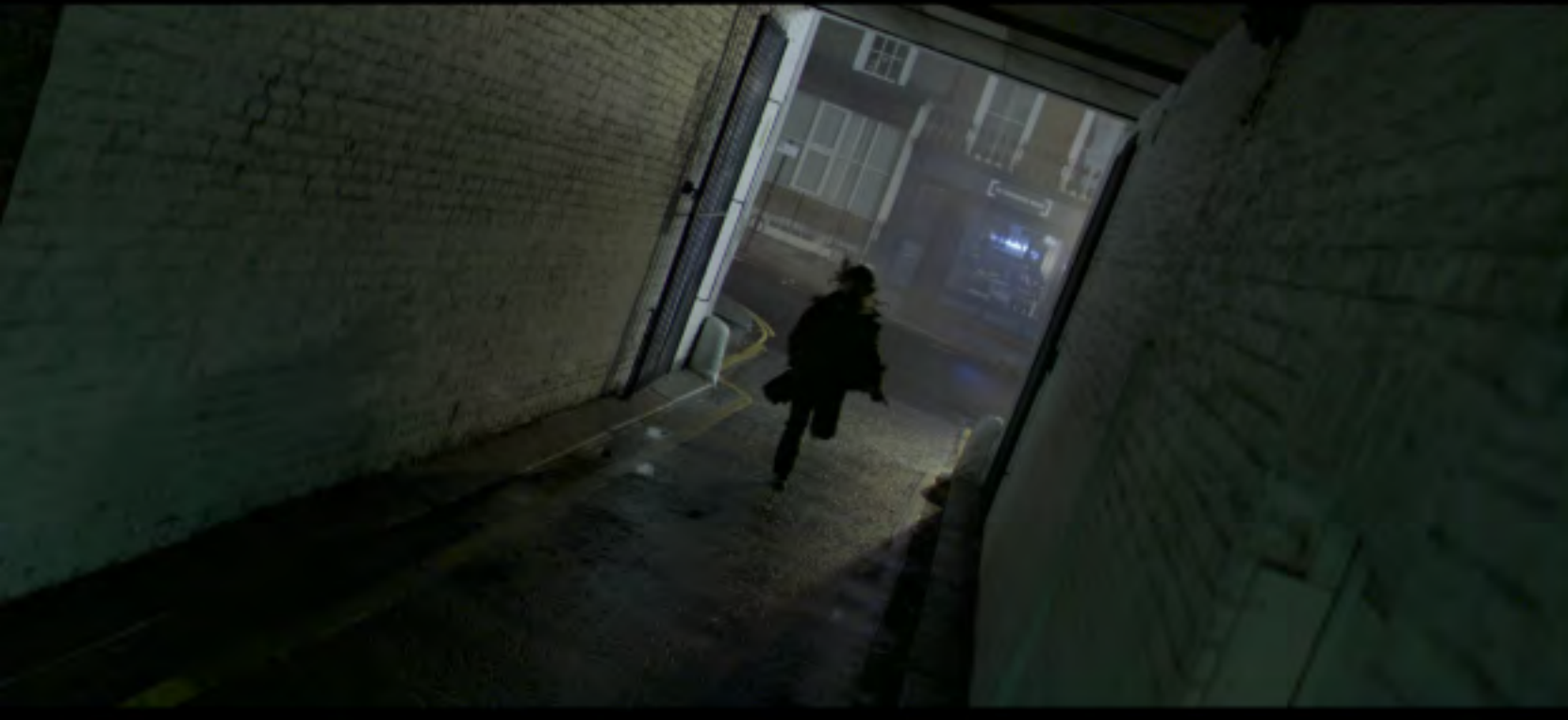
Only through teamwork and perseverance can we achieve our goals.
